Dear Ms. Snyder:

Thank you for the letting us help you decide what to put on your new playground. In my opinion you should have a spider web leading up to a corkscrew slide.

A slide is an inclined plane that you have to push yourself down by sitting at the top of the slide and using the force you have to push yourself down the slide. A spider web is also an inclined plane that you use your arms to pull and your legs to push yourself to the top of this roped structure.

I have a few reasons that might convince you to have a spider web leading up to a corkscrew slide on your playground. To start, one reason is that a lot of older kids like to climb up equipment and slide down equipment. Most of the playgrounds I go to have kids that are usually playing on the slides and if there are spider webs they will play on the spider webs. Second, when kids climb up a spider web they are exercising and when they go down the slide they give their muscles some time to heal. This is important because exercising is very good for you. From my field work I noticed slides and spider webs are very common on playgrounds. I also noticed the slides and spider webs were always being used. Lastly, kids get a lot of excitement out of going up to high places. An example is that older kids love going up to high places and sliding down.

To summarize, a spider web leading up to a corkscrew slide would be great for kids to have on your playground. I can't wait to see what ends up on the playground from our letters!
