## Continuous Learning

Thank you for helping with our Continuous Learning plans! Here are some reminders about the APS guidelines:

### Primary Instruction (Grades K-2)

K instruction= 30 minutes a day

1st and 2nd grade= 45 minutes a day

Families have several options. Please select which is best for your family and child:

1. Paper packets- available for pick-up at all food sites.
2. AETV- broadcasted literacy lessons.
3. Google classroom– Campbell teacher created and updated. Includes links to Raz Kids and Dreambox. Specialists (Art, Music, etc...) have created Google classrooms as well that students are invited to join.

### Upper grades (Grade 3-5)

- Students should be working 45 minutes to an hour per day.
- Instruction is in the student's homeroom teacher's Google classroom.
- Specials teachers- including band and orchestra are also posting lessons.

## Device Use

Please encourage students to get outside safely and when possible for walks or bike rides. Students should not be on video games and other screens for long periods of time. In order to access materials posted by teachers, students in grades K-2 with older APS siblings should be sharing their devices. Students may need to be reminded that school devices are not for video games, they are for learning. Thank you!
